Class Information

Hedgehogs

In Reception, we have worked really hard on the Baseline Assessments this week, showing what we can already do in English and Maths. We have also been looking at how to make numbers and have put socks into pairs. In Year 1 we have been practising counting and writing numbers, making sure that we write them accurately. We have also started our Spelling Frame where we have been learning how to spell key words that we can use in our writing. Next week we will start to look at how to describe autumn things using adjectives and nouns. In Science, we learned about different types of animals so that we can classify them next week. In Art, we really enjoyed looking carefully at ourselves so that we could draw self-portraits.

Our Shining Light this week is awarded to Reggie, for consistently being an excellent role-model to the younger children.

Squirrels

This week our lessons have been centred around our topic of Africa. In Geography we have learnt about the equator and the temperature changes around here and in the different hemispheres. We have also taken a deeper look at Egypt and even tasted some delicious Egyptian foods. We have been focusing on our presentation this week, from the tidiness of tables to the work in our books, and in our handwriting too. We have made amazing progress with our handwriting and writing in general. Next week we will be collating our knowledge of Africa to write our information texts. In Maths, we will be moving on to our next topic of addition and subtraction. In Art, we will begin to study collage with the model of Henry Matisse.

Our Shining Light this week goes to Logan G, who has shown huge resilience and courage this week. He felt uncertain and worried about his learning at the beginning of the week and by Thursday he was not only completing work independently but volunteered for Children's Worship.

Foxes

This week we have developed our knowledge of the scientific names of teeth through a practical cutting and sticking activity that has produced some amazing mouths! We cannot wait to conduct a tooth experiment next week to investigate tooth function and strength.

Another amazing week from Otters! We have been ordering, comparing and rounding numbers in Maths, working on expanded noun phrases, similes and metaphors in English to use in our setting descriptions, naming and locating countries in Europe, and identifying the different types of teeth and describing their function in Science.
