## **Class Information**

#### Hedgehogs

In Hedgehogs we have been reading the story of Little Red Riding Hood discussing the story and acting it out. It was funny how many of us wanted to be the Big Bad Wolf! We will use what we know about the story to write and illustrate our own Little Red Riding Hood story next week, changing one of the characters. In Maths, Reception children were looking at how to represent numbers 1, 2 and 3 with objects, sorting objects into sets. Next week we will match amounts of objects to the number digit. Year 1 children were learning about number families and different ways to make 10. We then wrote these into number sentences. Next week we will find number bonds and add more to an amount. We have also been working hard learning our Harvest Festival song to perform for you.

Reading congratulations to: Oliver B, Reggie, Teddy, Oliver G and Ronnie for achieving at least 10 reads at home and recording them in their Home Reading Record. Congratulations also to Charlotte, Isaac and Jasper for achieving their 25 reads at home.

#### **Squirrels**

In Squirrels this week, we have been diving into the world of problem solving and reasoning in Maths. We have explored how we can use our number bonds to 10 to help us find bonds to 100, and 1000. We have then used this knowledge to solve multi-step problems. In English, we went on an archaeological adventure to the Valley of the Kings and explored Tutankhamun's tomb, ready for the 100th anniversary of its discovery next month. Children interviewed "Howard Carter" and came up with some brilliant, probing questions that helped us to learn a lot more about the Ancient Egyptians. In Science, we investigate shadows; how and why they change over the day.

Our Shining Light this week is Ellie-May for taking such pride and care in her work this week. She has made extra effort to make sure she understands a task before beginning and has challenged herself to go beyond the targets set for tasks. Superstar!

#### Foxes

This week in our Maths and English lessons we have started our first Year 4 assessments. This is a culmination of all that has been learnt in Years 3 and 4 and highlights the areas of development as well as celebrating the success of the children so far. Miss Joisce is so impressed with the children's positive, 'can-do' attitude in these lessons. We are looking forward to writing our suspense story next week.

#### Message from the Executive Headteacher:

#### Pupil Voice;

As you may know, we check in with our children once a half-term to see how they are, how their learning is and how they are feeling in school. Each half-term has a slightly different focus and this half-term we looked at how they felt about coming back to school. We asked the following:

What was **fun** or kept you **happy** during the summer? What was **not good**? Did anything **worry** or **scare** you, or give you a **funny feeling**? What did you **enjoy on devices** - phone, tablet, TV....? What did you **NOT enjoy on devices** - anything bad, scary or worrying? What are you **looking forward to at school** this term?

### Is there anything worrying / you are not looking forward to?

Do you have at least one adult in school that you can talk to and that you feel comfortable with?

Strengths were that 100% of pupils feel that they have at least one adult in school that they can trust. Concerns or worries about school were unique to individuals and a high proportion answered that they didn't have any concerns.

An area of concern was very much ICT based – many of the children could talk about something on their devices that had worried or scared them over the Summer.

Any individual concerns have been talked through with the children or the class as appropriate by the teacher. The ICT concern is something that the leadership team have considered and decided that we will respond by firstly creating a reference booklet that might provide some information about sites, devices, age limits etc. Secondly, we are exploring the idea of an information evening with a speaker. So we want to hear from you - is this an issue that you'd like support with, what could we do as a school to support you and would you welcome such an evening? Please get in touch via the office with any feedback. Many thanks.

Overall, the feedback was extremely positive and our children are noticeably happy and settled in school. Recent monitoring by Governors and DNEAT noted their enthusiasm for their learning and their super knowledge. Well done children and well done our super staff team for making learning fun. Who wouldn't want to go to school and interview Howard Carter and explore Tutankahmun's tomb?!
