This week in Squirrels, we had a wonderful time sharing our science knowledge with our families at the Parent Café. We had investigated how materials can be transparent, translucent and opaque, and used these qualities to decide on the best materials to make a shadow puppet theatre. In Maths, we have been looking at adding and subtracting on a number line and finding the multiples of ten that a number sits between. In English, we have written gripping diary entries for the discovery of Tutankhamun's tomb, in the voice of Howard Carter. In Art, we have been creating decorative, intricate headdresses for an Egyptian person, using our collage skills that we have been practising over the half-term.
