Nursery Consultation

We are exploring the opportunity to extend our primary provision to include a new school-based nursery for children of 3 to 4 years of age from September 2023. We believe that this proposal will enable the continued provision and growth opportunities for pre-school facilities in Narborough and the surrounding community. It is proposed that the two existing rooms where Reception and Year One currently are will accommodate both the Nursery and Reception classes creating an EYFS unit. We feel that this is a really exciting opportunity to provide a service that is greatly needed in Narborough and could save many families and young children having to travel out of the village to access nursery provision for children aged 3 and 4 years. As part of the proposal, we are consulting with all stakeholders to give information and find out if the community would want this provision to go ahead. More information will be added to our website.

Even if you do not have children that would attend the provision, we would like to know if you are happy for Narborough CE Primary Academy to extend our admittance age from 4 years to 3 years. The children in Year 1 have been working really hard on their Reading and Mathematics PiXL assessments this week. They have shown really good focus and been proud to show what they have learned. Reception children have also been working hard to show their key skills. We have been practising our letter and number formations and had fun adding up our scores with letter tiles. Charlotte found that 'x-ray' scored her 14 points, but 'xylophone' beat it with a whooping 24 points! We read words to match them to pictures and created some fantastic patterns on the peg boards. Next week, we will be writing our diaries in English and measuring length and height in Mathematics. In DT, we used what we had learned last week about vegetables to consider what healthy eating looks like, so that we can design a healthy meal next week. We looked really brilliant in our World Book Day costumes and had a lot of fun listening to the adults reading us their favourite story.

Squirrels

We spent some of the day retelling our stories with a twist and some super writing. Our Maths this week has been finding the perimeter of different 2D shapes, looking at finding missing lengths and consolidating the process. This learning will really help us with our work next week that looks at finding the perimeter of different polygons. We have finished the big write of our explanation texts, decorated them, edited and improved and added a final flourish this week! Next week, we can start our thoroughly exciting unit looking into Greek myths, beginning our narrative and descriptive writing. If the stories from World Book Day are anything to go by, I am sure that this unit will be full of wonderful writing.

This week feels like it has flown by! On Tuesday, the Year 6s represented the school at the Hi-5 Netball Tournament at TNHA. The children were impeccably behaved, continually evaluating and improving their performance and demonstrated great sportsmanship. Many thanks to Mrs Adcock for coming with us and

being so supportive. In Maths, the Year 5s have begun to explore decimal numbers and the link between fractions, whilst the Year 6s have been completing their unit of learning on ratio and proportion, solving problems including scaling up/down recipes. In RE, we summarised the Easter story whilst considering why this festival is so important to Christians. In Science, we have begun our new unit of learning about living things. We dissected flowers to identify their different parts and explored their role in reproduction. For World Book Day, we chose our own favourite story to re-write with a twist and explored how to use our voice and gestures to tell the story in a lively and engaging way. We have also been diving into the world of Ancient Greece through reading a selection of myths and beginning to explore how the ancient civilisation was organised.


