Nursery Consultation Update

As you know, our nursery consultation finished on Friday, 14th April and we would like to update you with the information we currently have. There were 33 responses, of which the majority of 22 agreed with the need for a nursery at Narborough. We are so pleased and thank you for your support. We have now submitted the results to the (DNEAT) Trust Board who will review the results and make an application to the Regional Schools Commissioner's Office via the Headteacher Board to extend our school age range to 3-11 years. We will keep you informed of the outcome and any progress.

Children's Worship

The children reminded us to use strategies such as deep breaths, going to a quiet space and talking about our feelings.

Class Information

Hedgehogs

We have had a really interesting week this week learning about bees in Science and using information texts and videos to gather information about bees in English, so that we can write a report about them. We are considering three very important questions for our report:

What do bees look like? How do bees pollinate flowers? How can we help bees? Please ask your children what they have found out and how they can help our bees. In Maths, we have been working hard on finding halves and quarters in Year 1 and explaining now, then and next problems in Reception. We had to work out how many objects had been added or taken away and how many there were before and after. In Art, we have been printing repeating patterns and in our own learning, making stunning flowers.

We have no reading certificates this week and some children have only added one or two reads this whole week. Please remember how important it is to listen to your child read every day and record it for them so that they can earn their rewards.

Congratulations to our Shining Light this week, awarded to Samuel for hard work and effort in writing and Mathematics. He has produced some really impressive work this week.

Squirrels

Squirrels have been in siege mode this week! They have immersed themselves in the world of medieval warfare - making the frame for their lolly stick trebuchets and writing their explanation texts on the weapon, explaining how the parts interact. Some fabulous group and independent work seen on these tasks. The children were very excited (and responsible) when using glue guns on their project.

In Science, they have been experimenting on eggs to understand the impact of sugary foods and drinks on their teeth; investigating also what difference toothpaste makes to a tooth's health.

Foxes

In Foxes this week, we have welcomed our Year 5s to learn alongside us in our core lessons. This has not only been a valuable collaborative learning exercise but has also shown off what wonderful learning behaviours we have at Narborough CE Primary Academy. The children have really flourished with independent learning in Maths, using their partner's knowledge and learning environment to help them if they get stuck. We have started a Maths unit on shape this week which looks at identifying, ordering and comparing angles. Next week, we will continue to apply this knowledge while looking at lines of symmetry in polygons. The writing focus this week has been a lot of fun! We have entered into a national poetry competition run by Young Writers. The Year 4 & 5 children have each created a monster and written a narrative poem about it to be entered into the competition. They have included sophisticated descriptive phrases, narrative plot lines and rhyming schemes. I look forward to updating you on our progress after the 26th May.
