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Safeguarding

I just wanted to thank all our families for your work in ensuring that your children are in school. I was reading a thesis on attendance recently and one or two facts struck me: firstly, children showing chronic levels of absence in their Reception year (ie missing 10% of the year - just 10 days across the year, which is 2 sessions a day) are already behind academically by the time they enter Year One.

That means at 5 or 6 years old, a child who has missed 10 days in Reception already has huge gaps in their learning - and knows that there are things they don't understand or can't do - and secondly if their level of absence doesn't change, then they are significantly likely to fail to reach the expected standard in Y6, and then equally likely to go on to fail to achieve GCSE passes.

So a huge thank you to all our Parents/Carers who are making sure that your children have the best possible chance of achieving well.

Message from the Executive Headteacher....

Congratulations to all our children, as over the course of these last two weeks, as part of our first term's assessment of our school, I have been looking at their books, talking to them about their learning and listening to their views on school. Our children are a real credit to us and to you all; they are articulate and polite, helpful and enthusiastic about their learning.

Members of our Trust have been impressed with them and also with our excellent teaching team. Super attendance and super behaviour are also testimony to your support for your children. Well done everyone and I look forward to seeing you all at some upcoming Christmas celebrations!
