

Thank you for responding to the questions about online safety. Across the Federation, we had 49 responses with most people saying that they are feeling quite confident but that any information is helpful.

People felt that this column is helpful as follows: Strongly agree: 15 Agree: 23

10 said they didn't know whether it was useful or not and 1 parent disagreed that it was helpful.

In summary, the vast majority were very positive, with some lovely comments; thank you for taking the time to write those. 3 were not as positive, and I have followed up one issue and will follow up with another family. One was anonymous and so I am unable to follow up, which is a concern as we cannot help that situation if we do not know who it is that is unhappy. Letting you all know what your children is learning has come out as a strength, with 100% of families in agreement, which is excellent as this has been an area for development in the past

been an area for development in the past. Everyone bar one parent felt there is a good range of subjects available. The only suggestion for improvement outside the three families that I will follow up with was to try hard to share more photos about what the children are doing on Dojo. This is something we talked about at the last Parents/Carers' Forum and something we would like to do, but require investment in our ICT to enable us to do this. We will keep trying to find a way to achieve this.

There were 16 responses, which is not a huge sample, and I would be grateful to hear from more people so that I know we are getting an accurate representation.
