

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

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According to a recent Ofcom report", what percentage of children below the age of 11 have had a social media account setup for them by a parent? Fifty-eight percent - the top five most popular being: You Tube (33%), TikTok (18%), WhatsApp (17%) Snapchat (14%) and Facebook (9%). It's worth noting that on 11th April 2024, WhatsApp is changing their minimum age to allow children aged 13+ to use the service (down from 16). WhatsApp offers end-to-end encryption - a security feature that scrambles messages to ensure no one can view the contents. can view the contents.

How much do children (aged 8 -17) spend on video games (including in-app purchases)? The Insights Family* data (Ofcom, 2023) suggests that children aged 8-17 who spent money on video games (including in-app purchases) had spent an average of £38 in the past month month.
